1.4. Treasurer's Report

Ron Schott, Treasurer reported that current funds on hand as of 10/10/17 total approximately \$26,000. Ron circulated Desert Schools Bank reports with account and transaction details for Board reference which are included at the back of these Minutes.

Our nominal run rate for necessary expenses has dropped from approximately \$5-6K per year to some \$4K per year. Mala and Mark have arranged for Board Meeting lunch to be provided at a significantly lower cost. Steve Peters has obtained a refund of several months of MadMimi fees and put the account on hold. Ron has cancelling the online QuickBooks subscription linked to our bank accounts as unnecessary with the limited number of transactions we process. Ron has successfully set up our IRS efile account and is using it for convenient filings.

Mark will review with Crag Stevenson the need for an Outlook e-mail service we are paying a monthly subscription for and likely cancel it going forward. Mark will also review GoDaddy domain registration credentials and billing with Craig. Craig has several hundred dollars in accumulated reimbursement due and will document and coordinate payment with Ron.

Our current Directors and Officers (D&O) insurance policy with Aon is due to expire on 3/18/18. They will not renew it as part of their business evolution, but have identified a firm to issue a similar policy. Ron will follow up and resolve.

1.5. ATIC Board Membership

Motion: Elect Marisa Walker of the Arizona Commerce Authority who has been an active participant presenting to ATIC in the past and attending Board meetings recently as an ATIC Board Member.

Over the last two years we have had six Board members step down, Michele Norin and Michael Stull due to job relocation, as well as David Daniels, John Lucas, Ralph Gierish, and Robert Backie for personal reasons. Over the same period Cathy Poplin (who for personal reasons soon resigned), Matt Dostal, Jay Schlum, Bobby Davis of Payson, and Marisa Walker of the ACA have been elected to the Board. Nan Williams is backfilling for Cathy Poplin representing AzTEA and hopefully will soon join the Board.

We continue to need to expand participation with direct State of Arizona representation, as well as focus on rural and native stakeholder representation especially from the economic development community, and representatives from municipal, county, and higher education CIOs going forward.

Karen Ziegler, State of Arizona FirstNet Project Manager has been the primary impetus for the State's current broadband planning process and actively engaged with ATIC this year. She will confer with Matt Hanson, Statewide Grant Administrator at the Arizona Office of Grants and Federal Resources and depending on State support for a Broadband Office and initiatives going forward, assist with recruiting herself or another appropriate representative from ADOA.

ATIC Associates John Lucas, former CIO of Graham County and SACCCNet visionary now with his own technology consulting firm and Michael Britt of Copper Dome Consulting and former State of Arizona FirstNet Manager are both being encouraged to attend Board and working group meetings, as well as consider Board membership going forward.

Satish Pattisapu has replaced Mark Masterson as the CIO of the Arizona Department of Education and thus manages much of Arizona's K-12 IT deployment and integration. Milan Eaton works for Satish as ADE's K-12 E-Rate Coordinator and partners with Mala at Arizona State Library to drive Arizona e-rate utilization and impact. Mala has previously engaged Satish on behalf of ATIC and he's been added to our Associates contact list. Mala will invite him to give an information presentation at an upcoming Board Meeting.

Jeff Sobotka has changed employment from AT&T to T-Mobile and has remained on the ATIC Board representing T-Mobile and leaving AT&T without a Board presence for the first time since our foundation. A few months back Mark Goldstein encouraged Jerry Fuentes of AT&T to provide a new AT&T representative. Mark will follow up and reengage.

1.5.1. Nominations and Election of Officers

Mark Goldstein stepped down as Secretary as of April 12, 2017, but remains on the Board and continues to perform the Secretary's duties on a pro tem basis. No other nominations for Secretary were put forward at this meeting, so the office remains unfilled.

Brenda Beall, ATIC Chair has been unable to serve in that capacity for much of the year due to her now living in New York and some health challenges. We send our thoughts and prayers for her health and wellness.

Annual elections of officers are scheduled for the ATIC Board meeting on March 14, 2018. Logistics for nominations and elections will be forthcoming.

2. Informational Presentations

2.1. ADOA Broadband Focus Group Findings Report, State Broadband Office, and Strategic Plan Outlook (Karen Ziegler, Bonnie Maney)

Since the Arizona Department of Administration (ADOA) and other executive branch departments held their Arizona Statewide Broadband Planning event on June 29, 2017, Karen Ziegler, Arizona FirstNet Project Manager (<https://azfirstnet.az.gov/>) and Bonnie Maney of Mission Critical Partners (MCP, <http://www.mcp911.com/>) have been undertaking provider and other stakeholder engagement, reengaging in State broadband strategic planning.

ATIC's contributions to the Digital Arizona Council's Broadband Strategic Plan in the 2011-2013 timeframe have been repeatedly acknowledged and that draft plan in its various length forms is being leveraged to inform and direct today's strategic planning initiatives. ADOA has requested that broadband providers submit fiber infrastructure maps to AZGEO for confidential use in middle mile gap analysis and strategic planning, but cooperation has been limited to date.

Five listening sessions were held for citizens and regional government in Payson, Prescott, Douglas, Kingman, and Parker, as well as a separate session for broadband providers. The findings have been summarized and are being used to inform the strategic process. A small advisory group has been meeting with ADOA and MCP (including ATIC's Mark Goldstein, Janet Major, Mala Muralidharan & Marisa Walker) to workshop strategic issues and review key documents. The Arizona Broadband Strategic Plan is expected to be completed and submitted to ADOA management and the Governor's Office by the end of February recommending among other things that the State reestablish an active Broadband Office staffed initially with two FTEs.

3. Activity Reports

3.1 Rural Community Outreach (Bill Bolin, Henry Goldberg, Karen Ziegler)

The ACC AUSF \$8M allocation and the \$3 million budgeted by the Legislature to leverage the FCC e-rate broadband infrastructure for rural K-12 schools and libraries opportunity was discussed and significant advance work is underway to optimize participation in the next e-rate cycle with an emphasis on consortia efforts and county-wide RFPs where practical.

Ken Dewitt, CIO, Navajo County is managing the Navajo-Gila County IT Education Consortium's RFP for Regional Fiber Build & Services representing up to 1,000 miles of fiber deployment at up to \$80M and ongoing backhaul and provisioned services to be largely paid for under regular and special e-rate programs. Ken will be asked to give an informational presentation on this for our next Board meeting on February 14, 2018.

There is a public private partnership (PPP) where Zayo is running fiber from Phoenix to Tucson and community stakeholders are asking for an off ramp on SR 79. There is also fiber being deployed along I-40, but seemingly not much interest in providing an off ramp to Tusayan where options include support from e-rate, bonds, go it alone to finance, PPP, and/or the USDA loan program. Additionally, the community of Page is proving a great example of a partnership. Henry Goldberg received a call from Bob Brenner with an infrastructure company interested in broadband, Henkels and McCoy and will follow up for more info.

John Kelly reported Microsoft has selected Arizona as one of thirteen states where they are developing a wireless partnership with a rural ISP to utilize white space spectrum to deliver broadband to an Arizona community. John also reported that Verizon Wireless is exploring possibilities around Yuma.

3.2 K12/GAZeL Education Report (Steve Peters, Nan Williams)

GAZeL continues with monthly Phoenix-Tucson-remote networking events scheduled at a variety of interesting technology firm facilities. They along with the Arizona Innovative Learning Collaborative and in partnership with ATIC are producing the Arizona Cybersecurity Education Resources & Solutions Forum & Networking in four Arizona locations (Phoenix, Tucson, Sierra Vista, Prescott) or online on January 30, 2018 with details and link below.

GAZeL is planning a conference on disruptive learning for the Spring of 2018 at a Tucson venue TBD including a planning exercise for schools and district implementation and a closing reception. Science Foundation Arizona and/or Helios Project may support. More details to follow.

Possible Augmented Reality (AR) and Virtual Reality (VR) projects in conjunction with Labster (<https://www.labster.com/>) for select rural schools are being considered jointly by ATIC, GAZeL, and AZTEA. This could be relevant to both high schools and community colleges.

3.3 Arizona State Library (Holly Henley, Mala Muralidharan)

The Arizona Library Association (AZLA, <http://www.azla.org/>) held their annual conference from October 25-27, 2017 at the Mesa Convention Center. Mala presented on Broadband Transforming Libraries. Many of the presentations remain available for viewing/download at <http://2017.azla.org/conference-presentations/>.

State Library personnel have been visiting a number of libraries around the State to hold workshops and help with technology assessments. State Library is also working with Electronic Super Highway on webinars for broadband in rural areas and access to their tools, templates, etc. that explain importance of broadband in rural areas.

In support of the e-rate infrastructure support for K-12 and libraries, they have helped form a Navajo-Gila County consortium of schools and libraries, while Apache, Santa Cruz, and Yavapai

Counties remain additional consortium candidates. E-rate filing deadline for this cycle is March 22, 2018 and it's full speed ahead to optimized utilization of the Arizona funds and FCC special program.

State Library is supporting The Hotspot Project where students can borrow an access point from their local library for home use. Jeff Sobotka of T-Mobile indicated that they are providing hotspots in several communities through local libraries.

3.4 Telehealth (Janet Major)

The Arizona Telemedicine Program (<http://telemedicine.arizona.edu/>) will hold their annual Telemedicine & Telehealth Register Service Provider Showcase (SPS, <http://tspworld.com/>) in Glendale on October 8-9, 2018.

3.5 Government Affairs (Mike Keeling, Mark Goldstein)

Mike Keeling, Mark Goldstein, and Ron Schott actively contributed to the Arizona Technology Council's annual Public Policy Guide (<https://www.aztechcouncil.org/promoting-public-policy/public-policy-guide/>) recently issued for the 2018 season. Ron Schott distributed hard copies to the Board meeting attendees.

At this time no telecom related bills are expected at the Legislature, though we will track matters and report as the session progresses. ATIC would like to see the ACC expand the use of the new AUSF funds beyond e-rate matching to other rural broadband purposes.

Mike Keeling indicated that this year's telehealth policy initiatives were like to be to strengthen the existing telehealth bill with the addition of other specialties and to work towards interstate nursing licensure.

3.6 ATI Institute (John Kelly, Oris Friesen)

John Kelly, ATIC Board Member and ATI Institute Chair was tasked to explore the potential of ATI Institute working with Matt Hanson, the Statewide Grants Administrator (to whom Karen Ziegler reports) to promote and facilitate broadband grant activity.

Mark Goldstein, ATIC and ATI Institute Board member was tasked to coordinate a meeting with Ron Schott and Jeremy Babendure to explore possible partnerships and collaboration with the Arizona Technology Council Foundation (<https://www.aztechcouncil.org/serving->

[arizona/aztc-foundation/](#)). The meeting was held on November 6, 2017 and was largely cross-educational about the respective organizations with some developmental dialogue about possible joint projects or collaborative relations going forward. Oris' minutes were distributed to all. Mark is tasked with coordinating a follow up meeting in the coming months.

An ATI Institute Board meeting was held to refresh the officers' standing and work on future plans. The organization is essentially in stasis and has decided to let its D&O insurance lapse to conserve funds as there are no active projects currently.

4 Information and Action Plans

4.1 Discussion of ATIC Partnership & Business Model Working Group - Oris Friesen, Henry Goldberg & Mark Goldstein (Summary of the December 11, 2017 Working Group Meeting)

Karen Ziegler provided a brief update on the Status of the State Rural Broadband Focus Groups Report, the details of which can be found in the separately issued Working Group Report dated December 11, 2017. She reiterated her intent to report on it at the January 10th ATIC Board meeting. She also announced that a strategic planning session, facilitated by Bonnie Maney of Mission Critical Partners, would be held in early January. She also reported that ADOA has developed a budget and proposal for a state broadband office being considered for submittal to the Governor's office as part of ADOA's budgeting process. She also noted that the state cartographer position at the Arizona State Land Department (ASLD) remains unfilled.

Mala Muralidharan gave a brief update on E-rate activity, which is having limited degrees of success because many schools and libraries don't have the resources to apply. She also noted that self-provisioning of fiber infrastructure is not possible under these grants.

Steve Peters proposed convening an ATIC-led Roundtable in early 2018. He suggested that ATIC should facilitate a roundtable discussion of key state government officials and other stakeholders to follow up on the state broadband rural focus groups/strategic plan regarding important issues such as state government leadership in the broadband area, state/ACC funding and leveraging E-rate funding. The WG members decided to go forward with his proposal.

Steve and Henry Goldberg reported on progress on the proposed GAZeL-ATIC-AzTEA Labster virtual online lab partnerships project for Arizona schools, community colleges, and universities. This activity will lead to creation of a draft project document and possibly a consortium to seek funding and to license Labster for Arizona educational institutions. The hope is to have a follow-up in-person meeting soon, possibly at SkySong, and have Angie Odom provide a demo of Labster.

Mark, Oris and Henry reported on a meeting with Jeremy Babendure to discuss a potential partnership between ATI Institute (ATII) and the Arizona Technology Council (AZTC) Foundation. No conclusions were reached and a further discussion with Jeremy about ATII may be held in 2018.

Mala gave a brief report on plans for the ATIC website. Mike Whipple said he has a copy of an old ATIC website that was built with Drupal, and it could easily be restored and used as a baseline for evolving for current needs. Mala, Mike and Mark agreed to meet and follow up on this.

4.2 Discussion of Action Plans for Proposed Broadband Stakeholder Engagement Event(s) (Steve Peters)

Steve Peters proposed convening an ATIC-led Roundtable in early 2018, facilitating discussion by key state government officials and other stakeholders to follow up on the state broadband rural focus groups/strategic plan regarding important issues such as state government leadership in the broadband area, State/ACC funding and leveraging E-rate funding.

Mike Whipple questioned the value of this roundtable because he felt that it might well lead to no action. Ron said and Mike agreed that the objective should be to have ATIC be an NGO intermediary among the State, providers, consultants, users, etc. on a continuous basis. With a general consensus to proceed, Mark suggested we go ahead and form a planning committee to focus on the education aspect. He and Mala offered to help and others are welcome.
