# ATIC Board Meeting Minutes

Mark Goldstein announced the immediate resignation of ATIC Chair Jay Schlum as an officer and from the Board due to business reasons and discussed the surrounding issues with all.

#### 1.4. Treasurer's Report

Ron Schott, Treasurer reported that current funds on hand as of September 9, 2019 total approximately \$22,007 with recent expenses. Ron circulated Desert Financial Credit Union reports with account and transaction details for Board reference which are included at the back of these Minutes.

Board action at this meeting encumbered \$5,000 between now and February 2020 for GAZEL support of the AZBSN and Labster Consortium as detailed below.

Without any current monetary sponsors, sustainability remains a concern. One of Steve Peter's tasks under the GAZEL AZBSN assistance is to seek sponsors, grants, and other sources of revenue going forward.

## 1.5. ATIC Board Membership

**Board Updates This Year:** Jeff Sobotka was reaffirmed as a Board Member in his new role at the Arizona Commerce Authority (ACA) and has since been appointed Director of Broadband. Karen (Knight) Miller, Business Development Manager at Zayo Group was elected to the Board. Several inactive Board Members were asked to step back to Associate roles leaving 24 current Board Members.

**New Chairman:** ATIC needs to identify and engage prospects for Chair.

**New Board Prospects:** We continue to need to expand participation with direct State of Arizona representation, as well as a focus on rural and native stakeholder representation, especially from the economic development community, as well as representatives from municipal, county, and higher education CIOs, plus of course stronger broadband industry participation going forward.

Jay Schlum, former Chairman had met individually with select current Board members to garner their opinions about ATIC in the current environment and gauge their interest in actively participating. With the redesigned website having launched, it seems timely to engage new Board prospects. A cover letter template to personalize has been developed for use when reaching out to new parties seeking their active involvement in ATIC and consideration of a Board role. ## **3. Activity Reports**

### **3.1 Arizona Broadband Strategic Plan & FirstNet (Karen Ziegler, Jeff Sobotka)**

Jeff Sobotka, Arizona Director of Broadband at the Arizona Commerce Authority (ACA), continues to meet people and communities statewide, seeking to partner with as many as possible and asks for suggestions and contacts with whom to connect. Jeff intends to gather regional broadband information and act as a clearinghouse for broadband stakeholders.

This year the ACA has \$3 million for grants to provide matching funds to offset construction costs of expanding broadband services in underserved rural areas or as planning grants to provide for community assessments or technical designs. Grants will be awarded to local partnerships or ventures with clear and achievable plans. The ACA program has launched with details available at <https://www.azcommerce.com/broadband/grant-opportunities/> along with other resources. Jeff indicated there is some \$550M newly available for federal rural broadband infrastructure grants and urged that cities and regions develop and submit applications for such funding and fully exploit e-rate funding, USDA grants, and other funding resources.

Arizona broadband middle mile backhaul capabilities remain insufficient in many areas, one example being Snowflake. With some minor regulatory reform and cooperation from the Arizona State Land Department (ASLD), we can enable utilities to sublease their fiber assets, thus electric grid infrastructure and associated ROW of the major utilities as well as electric coops could increasingly be utilized for rural fiber deployment delivering broadband service as well as wireless and wireline backhaul.

The State Strategic Broadband Plan has been updated, is undergoing internal review, and will be published shortly. The ACA Broadband page at <https://www.azcommerce.com/broadband/> links to the Arizona Broadband Strategic Plan from February 2018, as well as to Grant Resources and other Broadband Resources. The Arizona Digital Highways Bill is detailed online at <https://aset.az.gov/digital-highways>.

ATIC remains keenly interested in helping the State undertake such initiatives and provide leadership to help facilitate broadband development in areas such as hosting rural workshops, grant writing and reviewing, as well as advising and assisting. Several Board members suggested that ATIC continue to foster a dialogue to discuss our strategic and support role relative to the State in general and ACA broadband initiatives specifically.

Karen Ziegler, Arizona FirstNet Project Manager (<https://azfirstnet.az.gov/>) continues to support broadband strategy and initiatives while focusing on FirstNet. ADOA Director Andy Tobin has been active in rural broadband and e911 discussions. AT&T is aggressively working on FirstNet, having built 8 new towers with 19 additional ones in process. Over 5K public safety users are participation and the program is moving from pilot mode to full deployment.

### **3.2 Arizona Broadband Stakeholder Network (Steve Peters)**

The Arizona Broadband Stakeholder Network (AZBSN) was formed last year as a partnership between ATIC and GAZEL to facilitate discussion between key state government officials and other stakeholders, follow up on the State broadband rural focus groups and strategic plan issuance for leveraging State/ACC funding, assist with leveraging E-rate funding, and developing public private partnerships. The Arizona Broadband Stakeholder Network (AZBSN) web presence resides at <https://www.arizonatele.org/about-stakeholder-network.html>.

A leadership team led by Steve Peters developed and held a Broadband Stakeholder Roundtable on Tuesday May 28, 2019 from 2:00-6:00 PM at Rio Salado Community College in Tempe with registration of about 70 participants onsite and another 28 remotely. The program included former FCC Chairman Tom Wheeler's keynote, Schools, Health & Libraries Broadband (SHLB) Coalition federal legislative updates, updates from broadband leaders, ignite presentations, exhibitors, and networking. Several ATIC partners as well as a few sponsors exhibited. Event financials included sponsorships of \$2500 remitted to GAZEL out of which Steve Peters was paid a \$2250 fee for event coordination and production while ATIC provided \$988.21 to cover expenses. Steve Peters provided a GAZEL proposal distributed prior to the meeting for services to be provided by ATIC at a fixed cost over the next several months, including:

- A substantial, targeted, usable mailing list integrated to CRM software and support
- Additional Arizona Broadband Stakeholder Network (AZBSN) roundtables and seminars
- Seek AZBSN sponsors, grants, and other financial support
- Support for the Labster consortium for rural education

Mark Goldstein recapped responses from Board members not present including strong support from Jeff Sobotka and Andy Phelan, as well as some questions and concerns from Janet Major. Mark noted that Steve has filled out a "Conflict of Interest" form and he will thus recuse himself from voting on this and any related issues. Ron Schott restated his objections to paying any Board member for services as an ethical issue and thought Labster as a private company should not receive non-profit assistance to market their offerings. Ron felt that a proposal should be written for the proposed body of work, shopped around, and a contract process followed. Ron objects to what he calls an "ethical" issue. Mark objected to the ethics argument.



Henry, Mark, and Oris spoke in favor of the GAZEL proposal feeling that ATIC has delayed long enough, that the Conflict of Interest policy adequately covers Board members receiving payment for services, and seeing no problem in working with Labster to introduce new lab courses to rural areas. Steve indicated his willingness to step down from the Board to ameliorate any ethical issues. After further discussion, the original proposal was separated into two parts, one in support of the Arizona Broadband Stakeholder Network (AZBSN) and the other in support of the Labster Consortium efforts.

**MOTION: To approve \$4,000 in funding for GAZEL proposed activities in support of the Arizona Broadband Stakeholder Network (AZBSN) through February 2020.**

**The motion passed. Of the 10 Board members present, 8 voted in favor and 2 abstained including Steve Peters**

**MOTION: To approve \$1,000 in funding for GAZEL proposed activities in support of the Labster Consortium through February 2020.**

**MOVE: Mark Goldstein**

**SECOND: Nan Williams**

**The motion passed. Of the 10 Board members present, 7 voted in favor, 1 against, and 2 abstained including Steve Peters**

Following the passage of these motions, Steve Peters resigned from the ATIC Board effective immediately.

Steve will use Doodle polling to set the next AZBSN leadership team meeting. Both Steve and Mark are maintaining some ATIC and GAZEL limited distribution lists and using as needed. Steve will now merge these lists and work to acquire names and contact vectors of additional broadband stakeholders and interested parties to robustly rebuild our mailing list on a common CRM platform to enable, manage, and streamline stakeholder communication.

A separate means of vendor engagement by ATIC should be developed in parallel and will be on the agenda for future ATIC consideration and action.

### **3.4.2 Labster Virtual Laboratory Simulations Consortium**

GAZeL, ATIC, and AzTEA have established a project to explore interest, feasibility and a strategy to develop a statewide partnership and funding mechanism with Labster, the Virtual Laboratory Simulation Education Group based in Denmark, and K-12 schools, universities and community colleges to provide appropriate Labster virtual online lab modules for all educational institutions in Arizona for free or at a low cost. The feasibility of forming a consortium to provide Labster curricula throughout all of Arizona is being explored and a great meeting of interested parties was held on April 22, 2019. Byron Davies and Tom Schumann, Executive Director of the Gateway Community College (GCC) Center for Entrepreneurial Innovation (CEI), are getting engaged with Labster and have some grant money available. Further, Tom is potentially interested in using Labster modules for GCC's LabForce online workforce training system for the biosciences industry. ### **3.4.3 Generation Yes Computer Science & IT Training Programs**

Steve has continued to explore partnering with Dennis Harper of GenYes (<https://www.genyes.org/>) regarding working with banks on Community Reinvestment Act (CRA) which has evolved to allow funding for schools with the goal of their supporting broadband buildouts for nonprofits and schools. The national program involves billions of dollars. GenYes is focused on digital equity and the digital divide. Jeff Sobotka and Keith Watkins at ACA have expressed interest and will pursue.

### **3.4.4 Other Innovative Learning Collaborative Initiatives for 2019**

GAZeL is planning for a conference on disruptive learning at a Tucson venue TBD including a planning exercise for schools and district implementation and a closing reception. Science Foundation Arizona and/or the Helios Project may support.

Steve has been in dialogue with Adonis Trujillo of Microsoft who is interested in our initiatives and has some funding available. Microsoft has a number of projects with the University of Arizona including data center activities and recently purchased three large parcels in Goodyear, presumably for data center operations.

The GAZeL Board has been developing their priorities and adopted plans for the Innovative Learning Collaborative for 2019 including:

- Labster Virtual Laboratory Simulations Consortium (In partnership with ATIC)
- Generation Yes Computer Science and IT Training programs
- Collaborative Professional Development

- Innovative Learning Conference: Disruptive Innovative Learning: Strategic Planning for Innovation, Technology & Collaboration for our Arizona K-12 Schools, Universities, Community Colleges, Libraries & Community Organizations
- Open Education Resources Network
- Innovation Labs/Makerspaces Network
- State and Local Innovative Learning Plans
- Arizona Broadband Stakeholder Network (In partnership with ATIC)
- Federal Reserve Community Reinvestment Act (CRA) Digital Equity/Digital Divide funding opportunities (In partnership with ATIC)

### **3.5 Arizona State Library (Holly Henley, Mala Muralidharan)**

Mala reported on Arizona e-rate progress as we continue seeking to optimize our utilization of special ACC and ADE funds leveraging the FCC special infrastructure program expiring this year. The state has received some \$30M in e-rate funding, the 11th wave of funding released for this year. The State has begun their telecom RFP process for 2020.

State Libraries is in a sunset review process by the legislature and has received over 80 letter of support with the review report pending.

Arizona State Libraries used federal Library Services & Technology Act (LSTA) Funding to provide 53 grants totaling some \$678K to Arizona libraries under a variety of programs. Details and submittal guidelines for Arizona's LSTA grants is online at
